MILDENHALL WARREN LODGE MEDIA COVERAGE

Although we covered the official opening of the site in the last newsletter, what we did not know at that time was the very extensive media coverage the event generated – We featured in 7 newspapers, 2 radio programmes and on BBC TV's programme 'Look East'. All these items brought the Friends name to a wider audience and can only serve to help us in the future. We are also aware that the project is being used in some circles as an example of how co-operation between various agencies can work towards a better result for any project.

A BIT ABOUT BATS

Ten species of bats are known to occur in Thetford Forest. Some are known from listening in to their sonar calls and others from being observed in bat boxes, hibernacula and buildings.

The bat box programme was started in 1975 by Bob Stebbings and the Norfolk and Suffolk Bat Groups. The Forest currently has 378 bat boxes in groups of 18 in addition to the experimental boxes near High Lodge.

Species regularly recorded on the bat box checking days are Pipistrelle, Brown long-eared, Leisler's and Noctule, with the first two being by far the most common. Serotine and Natterer's have been recorded on rare occasions.

The Friends have spent considerable time and effort over the last two years both making and repairing the bat boxes in Thetford Forest and, as a result, most sets of boxes are largely complete and bat friendly. A recent innovation has been the addition of wire mesh on the bottom of the boxes to reduce the high levels of damage caused by squirrels and woodpeckers. The survey visits carried out during October 2003 found that only one of the boxes with the mesh had been 'broken in' to and this one was where a woodpecker had drilled a hole in the side, avoiding the mesh. There was quite a bit of evidence that attacks around the entrance of the boxes had been attempted but so far the wire mesh appears to have deterred them.

For interest the two new sets of boxes put up at High Lodge and at Mayday were well occupied in October, with one box at Mayday having 10 Long-eared bats in it.

A number of larger 'woodcrete' boxes, made from a mixture of sawdust, cement, resin etc, have been obtained by Norfolk Bat Group and it is planned to erect these at chosen locations during this winter.

Other bat sites in the Forest include the Santon Downham offices where a large maternity roost of Pipistrelle occurs in both the Forest Enterprise and the Forestry Commission buildings behind the wooden wall cladding.

Known hibernation sites included various wells and icehouses in addition to the purpose built hibernaculum at High Lodge. The latter regularly hold up to four species of bats in the winter with Natterer's, Daubenton's, Brown long-eared and the nationally rare Barbastelle. In the winter of 2001/2 a maximum of 6 Barbastelle were recorded hibernating here making this an important site for this species.

The success of High Lodge, both the hibernaculum and the Visitor's Centre, has resulted in plans being put together by Norfolk Bat Group and the Forestry Commission to build a new and larger hibernaculum. The site chosen is near the River Ouse. During the summer months many bats can be seen hunting insects in the river corridor and it is also an area that is relatively undisturbed in winter. It is hoped the Friends work party group will assist in clearing some of the scrub to provide a clear fly-way for the bats to find the entrance and also, later on, to assist with fitting out the interior of the hibernaculum with various artificial spots for the bats to roost in. The cost of the hibernaculum will be around £30000 and Anne Embry (Forestry Commission) is leading the search for funding. If successful construction of the site is due to commence in February 2003 to have the hibernaculum available for residence by bats later in the year, and the Friends will be involved from the start.

Thank you to all of you who have helped provide these threatened animals with a suitable home.
