## Mildenhall Warren Lodge Open Day.

Enjoy a visit to Mildenhall Warren Lodge, on Bank Holiday Monday 28<sup>th</sup> May, between the hours of 11am and 4pm and learn how rabbits were farmed for their fur and meat, from the fourteenth to the early twentieth century.

The Friends raised £49,000 to restore the building which was on English Heritage's building at risk register before we saved it.

The Warren Lodge is situated in Mildenhall Woods, on the minor road linking the A1065 and the A11 north of the Barton Mills Roundabout. From the A1065, the minor road is signed 'Household Waste Site & Elveden'; and from the A11 it is signed as 'Mildenhall.'

Turn in to the signed car-parking area. The Lodge is about ten minutes walk up the hill. This medieval building is not open to the public during the rest of the year. You could combine this with a visit to see the military orchids at the nearby Rex Graham Reserve for rare plants, which is also holding its' annual open day on Spring Bank Holiday Monday.

## **Lynford Arboretum**

It is pleasing to be able to report a successful start to this project with the first three working groups drawing between three and twelve people. The more one walks and works their way around the arboretum, the smaller, psychologically, it becomes, and with it the size of the task.

So far our efforts have been concentrated on cleaning the paths, removing debris fallen from the trees, picking-up surprisingly modest amounts of litter and looking to the long neglected shrubs. A genteel stroll around this tranquil place will reveal the changes which are taking place and hopefully you will agree that these are anything but startling.

The Forestry Commission, true to its word, have taken the bit between their teeth. The issue of personal protective equipment (PPE) is being sourced and ordered; The Forest District's Landscape Architect has produced a set of three drawings of the greater arboretum area, annotated with thought provoking suggestions. These will be discussed by the arboretum group over the next few meetings; nothing is set in stone. It is hoped that the group will have a base, on site, by the year's end. This will be in the shape of a modified steel freight container; the kind that you see arriving at Felixstowe on board huge ships. However it will be clad externally, with boarding of some type and the interior will be lined with plywood. Internally it will be divided into two; approximately a third for the storage of tool and equipment, the rest being given over to the promotion, to the public, of the forest in general, the many facets of the arboretum in particular and a small corner to Friends.

If you are at all interested in what the group is doing, why not come along and see us at work? We will be meeting on the fourth Sunday of each month between 9.30 and 12.30 with additional, midweek meets, planned for Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> May, Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> June and Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> July.

## Problems with the Post

The previous three mailings of newsletters and other information have been beset with a problem which has prompted justifiable complaints. Three members, there may have been more, were asked, by the Royal Mail, to pay a surcharge for an unstamped item of mail generated by Friends; something they are entitled to do.

On the first occasion there could well have been a mistake on my part; my sincere apologies to the member(s) concerned if this was so. Prior to the second mailing the entire 500 (plus) items were sorted into batches of 25, stamps affixed, checked, rechecked and posted; still a complaint. So to plan "C"; firstly a change of envelope, in case it was the type of paper they were made from could be a cause. Secondly, make sure one's hands were thoroughly clean, in case it was natural grease interfering with the adhesion of the stamps. Again the items were stamped, checked and rechecked in batches of 25, and yet again there was a complaint.

So what's the problem? The only thing left are the self-adhesive stamps, is the gum strong enough? A simple 'phone call to Royal Mail has set the ball rolling to hopefully find the cause and a solution. I was assured by the official that I spoke to that our conversation was being recorded, and that a transcript would be sent to the appropriate department; fortunately I did not hold my breath. One interesting piece of information was forthcoming; automatic sorting machines process four thousand (4000) items of mail, every minute.

If you have received unstamped communications from us please inform the secretary. Friends are determined to lick the problem..... Sorry about that one, but it may be the answer.

### **Thetford Forest Community Ranger.**

I have been asked to write a few lines to introduce myself and to give an outline of what I do within the Forest, My name is Dave Kingsnorth and I have been with the Forestry Commission for approx. 19 years. The role that I now play is far removed from anything that I have done with the forestry before, and involves engaging with the public at all levels, in order to enhance peoples enjoyment of the forest.

As you are no doubt aware not all people see the forest in the same light, we are seeing a constant stream of fly tipping, illegal vehicle access, along with a multitude of other anti social issues within the forest that I am trying to address.

We are now on Brandon and Thetford 'safer neighbour teams' which has resulted in some excellent cross agency cooperation, part of this will see police patrols visiting the forest from time to time. I have attended two crucial crew events so far with invites to do more, these are aimed at year 6 age groups and have yielded good positive results from people in this impressionable age group.

On Thursday the 03/05/07 around 10.00hrs there will be a crushing of a motorcycle seized by Suffolk police whilst being ridden illegally in the forest, the very same motorcycle will be shown to the public on Brandon market place Saturday the 05/05/07 where a police pod staffed by police, Forestry Commission, Trial rider fellowship, Motorcycle action group, fun on wheels UK, and the Diss motorcycle club will be sited between 07.00 – 1400hrs, please feel free to give us a visit.

I am actively seeking the involvement of members of the public as eyes and ears in the forest as this team approach works, between us we can all play a part in keeping Thetford forest safe.
