There was also careful monitoring of the mortar samples and all the stages of the repair by Philip Orchard, our architect, and Mr. Butler himself.

## **The Environment Panel**

Once again Anne Mason was your representative at the November 4<sup>th</sup> meeting held at High Lodge in the newly extended restaurant area, which everyone was impressed with. Before the meeting started two new members (Roger Goulding – Conservation Officer, and Paul Hill representing the cycling interests in the park) were welcomed onto the Panel by Mike Taylor, from Forest Enterprise.

Steve Rothera of English nature gave an update on the heathland re-generation programme and Anne Mason reported on the Warren Lodge restoration at Mildenhall. This was followed by a report from Nick Gibbons on the three latest Forest Design Plans, which define harvesting, conservation, wildlife and archaeological aspects for specific areas. The main focus of the meeting however was on the future plans for the High Lodge site itself, and in particular with reference to the proposed education building and its design and layout. There was much discussion on the way forward to achieve the best possible facilities for schools, adult education courses and corporate events. The funding for the project has already been secured by Forest Enterprise.

Next on the agenda was a report from Anne Embury (Forest Enterprise) who reported that funding had also been secured from the rural arts lottery fund to commission a feature for the High Lodge courtyard.

Even from this abridged report, it should be clear that there are many exciting projects around at the moment and we are grateful for Anne Mason sparing the time to attend these meetings, which enables us to keep you up to date on the future plans of Forest Enterprise.

## **Conservation Group**

The group continues to grow in numbers, but as always we welcome anybody else along to the days, even if only for part of the morning. The dates for the next 3 events are detailed below. On the relevant page of the website there are maps to show the location of the more remote sites.

It is also hoped to arrange a walk around the Hills and Holes pingos during the summer as this is not an area normally seen by the public and it is very different to other parts of the forest.
