### **Mildenhall Warren Lodge – Work Commences**

Since the last newsletter work has started on the restoration of the Warren Lodge at Mildenhall with the scaffolding going up on September 30<sup>th</sup> and we have high hopes that it will be finished by the end of November. We are very proud of our success in getting the funding for this project and have already received a certain amount of media coverage as a result, with hopefully far more to come on completion of the building work and the interpretive walks. For safety and security reasons during the work the site will be enclosed within fencing, but this will be removed once the building has been made safe.

## Conservation Group Days

On Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> September we all met up at Santon Downham and made our way down to the path that runs alongside the railway line. This area used to be heathland, but has gradually been overrun by trees, bushes and moss and so needed clearing to allow the return of the heather with its attraction for wildlife. By the end of the morning we had made a considerable impact and had transformed quite a stretch back to its original look. There are still some larger trees to be removed, but these were left for F.E. workers with the right equipment and training to deal with.

Our next scheduled date is October 13<sup>th</sup> when we will be at Hockham Hills & Holes doing yet more clearance work (The intended location was to be at Mildenhall Warren Lodge, but with the restoration work going on and the delay in the planned felling, it was decided to leave this until December).
